UK Revokes Trading Scheme—Changing Tides?

On 26 June 2008, the United Kingdom Dispersed Oil in Produced Water Trading Scheme was revoked with immediate effect. The scheme had been launched on 1 January 2006 and applied to discharges of dispersed oil in produced water as part of offshore petroleum operations. An anecdotal event, but interesting to note.

Emissions trading is for sure one of the policy instruments that is on the rise. Wikipedia defines Emissions Trading (or emission trading) as an administrative approach used to control pollution by providing economic incentives for achieving reductions in the emissions of pollutants. It is sometimes called cap and trade.

The concept is not new. Its origins go back more than 30 years. The first large-scale example of it can be found in the "cap and trade" system as part of US Acid Rain Program (started in 1995 with 445 facilities involved and targeting emissions of sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxides). A breakthrough came with the Kyoto Protocol on climate change and the related EU Emissions Trading Scheme (CO₂ emissions from some

10,000 installations covered). In the Netherlands there is an emissions trading scheme for nitrogen oxides emissions.

Although it is most commonly used in relation to air emissions, other more successful applications also exist in the water sector. In Australia, the New South Wales Government's Hunter River Salinity Trading Scheme started with a pilot scheme from 1995 to 2002 which gave a sound basis for successfully implementing the scheme with some 22 major industrial facilities involved in the scheme. It has been responsible for restoring the waters of the Hunter to an unprecedented level of freshness.

The success of most of the existing schemes has prompted many governments to follow the example. Existing schemes are being expanded and new schemes are pending or under development. The EU scheme will be extended in 2012 and is expected to also include the aviation industry. In the US, the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) is expected to start in 2009.

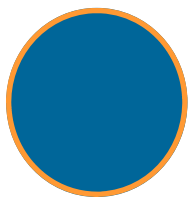
What about Lion Faeces in England...?

Waste is a highly regulated issue. What is to be considered waste is however defined differently in most countries. Some countries will focus their definition on the physico-chemical properties, while others will focus on the intention of the holder or a combination of both. In many countries, the definition is the outcome of a domestic evolution which will often also reflect cultural differences.

This is where we get to the question of lion faeces and dead pets collected along highways. They are both categories exempted, under certain conditions, from the need to obtain an environmental permit in the United Kingdom. According to the UK Environment Agency Guidance on Low Risk Waste Activities (version 32, February 2008), no environmental permit is required for the following waste storage/treatment activities:

- ◆ Secure storage, for up to 6 months, in a freezer of 5m³ of dead pets collected from highways
- ◆ Secure storage of 5m³ of lion faeces. The treatment of lion faeces by diluting with water which is then absorbed by clay pellets to make a cat deterrent.

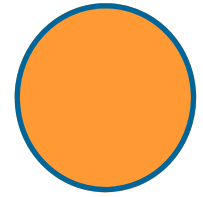

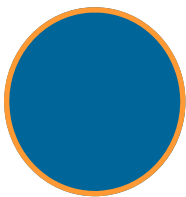

On 16 July 2008, the Australian Government released a discussion paper on the national emissions trading scheme, titled the Green Paper on the Carbon Pollution Reduction Scheme. The Australian Government announced its intention to implement a national emissions trading scheme by 2010 as part of the November 2007 election campaign.

In New Zealand the Climate Change (Emissions Trading and Renewables Preference) Bill is making its way. It results from the Government's intention to adopt an emissions trading scheme (ETS) with a transitional roll-out from 2008, with the aim of having all the major sectors included in the scheme by the start of 2013.

In Korea, Hong Kong and China, pilot schemes are being used to pave the way for the introduction of more substantial schemes.

These are just the top of the iceberg in terms of trading schemes. For business it has become a new reality on which you need to try to anticipate. Identify your vulnerabilities and explore ways to reduce your exposure.

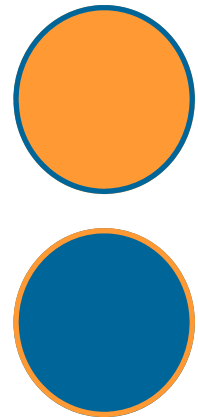

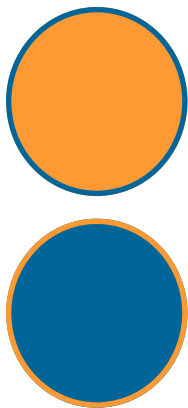
