On 15 November 2004, ISO published the revised, improved versions of its ISO 14001 and ISO 14004 standards. ISO 14001:2004 is easier to understand and easier to use. The intent of ISO 14001:2004 requirements has been made clearer. In addition, its compatibility with the ISO 9001:2000 standard for quality management systems, which is also used worldwide, has been increased. There is an 18 month transition period where certifications can still be made against the 1996 or 2004 versions.



REACH – Globally Harmonized System

Most companies are handling chemicals as a raw material and as such are confronted with the chemical regulations.

Restrictions on the use of chemicals are booming worldwide. The obligations to register, classify, label and package chemicals are also becoming increasingly complex.

Keeping track of what you are supposed to do in which country, what is acceptable and what is strictly prohibited can turn into a nightmare.

On top of this, two major initiatives are set to overhaul the legislation. A Globally Harmonized System is scheduled to be implemented between 2008 and 2012, and in the European Union the REACH initiative is likely to boost obligations to test and document the risks associated with the use of chemicals.

Enhesa has developed a number of tools and services to help you identify what is required from you and how to ensure ongoing compliance.

During September and October 2004 several new environmental, health and safety Regulations were adopted that could directly impact your business. Electrical and Electronic Equipment

If your company is putting electrical and electronic equipment on the market or supplying companies that do so, you will be familiar with the WEEE and RoHS Directives. Did you know that several Asian countries have adopted or are in the process of adopting similar Regulations?

By 13 August 2005 take-back systems have to be fully operational in all EU Member States. As it stands now, each Member State is taking a different approach on how to meet the requirements of the Directive. In some countries you will need to notify while in others you need a prior authorization. In some you will be able to contract a branch organization, in others you will need to report annually and prove that you have taken back the appropriate amounts of discarded equipment.

ENHESA is tracking on a daily basis what the regulations require from you in each country. Contact Enhesa if you need any support.

Regulatory Register

- After more than a dozen years helping international companies identify, analyze, understand and assess their compliance with the EHS regulatory requirements applicable to their overseas operations and product markets, ENHESA has developed a service focused on ensuring that each facility is aware of, and has access to, the EHS laws and regulations applicable to its activities and operations.
- ENHESA's EHS Regulatory Register was specifically designed to ensure conformity with the requirements of both ISO 14001 and OHSAS 18001. But more importantly, its purpose is to assist users to ensure full compliance with appropriate EHS requirements by developing and maintaining a full, up-to-date registry of the applicable EHS laws and regulations of the countries in which the company operates.
- The EHS Regulatory Register is a database that includes, for each country for which it is developed, a comprehensive list of the relevant and applicable EHS laws and regulations with which client operations must comply, including, as available, a hyperlink to access the text of the regulatory documents cited.
- The Regulatory Register can be kept up to date on a monthly or quarterly basis via ENHESA's EHS Regulatory Monitoring Service. When used in tandem with the Regulatory Register, the monitoring reports identify and explain the requirements of newly adopted and anticipated EHS laws and regulations in each country for which a Regulatory Register has been developed. Using the Monitoring Service, the Regulatory Register is updated for each country.
- The Regulatory Register is designed to allow the EHS Manager to tailor it to the facility and to keep it up to date. In case of doubt, ENHESA consultants are available to assist to identify the relevant applicable requirements. If there is no EHS Manager, ENHESA consultants can also come on site to tailor the Regulatory Register or provide Helpline support on an as-needed basis.
